Letter from the Director

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2020 was a year of growth and innovation. When we experienced school closures in March 2020, we had a choice to make - wait to return to normal or adapt. We decided we would try to reach students however we could, so we converted over 40 lessons into virtual video presentations and developed an online portal for teachers to access lessons and supplemental materials. As a result, we served over 9,390 students this year in-person or virtually. We feel honored to have been able to continue providing our services to the Tulsa area amid the challenges of the past year, and we are looking forward to the opportunities made possible by our new Virtual and Virtual Plus programming.

As we move forward and continue to reach Tulsa kids in the classroom and virtually, we need your help. The demand for Operation Aware is even greater next year as nicotine addiction continues to rise and mental health has been impacted by the missed peer interaction during Covid-19. The stress of distance learning and navigating social pressures through a screen has created new challenges for youth when it come to healthy friendships, relationships, and emotion management. It is clear - schools are eager to welcome back the personal touch of Prevention Educators and our important lessons. Our Virtual and Virtual Plus programs will allow us to continue to reach student in rural communities or districts with an increase in distance learning because of Covid-19 protocols.

With your help, we are positively impacting Oklahoma students one classroom at a time. All of this would not be possible without our generous supporters, so THANK YOU.





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What's New

Virtual and Virtual Plus

In the midst of 2020, the Operation Aware team converted over 40 lessons into video presentations to reach distance learning students virtually. Our prevention education team transferred as much of the personal learning experience possible from our 4th, 5th, 6th, 8th, and High School programs into the content. These presentations include the tools and skills our lessons highlight along with examples of implementation so that students have a clear picture of how to use them.

The Virtual Plus add-on includes a weekly Q&A session with a trained Prevention Educator who visits the classroom through Zoom or Google Meets platforms. As a result, students still connect with our educators in a way that is hard to describe. They ask questions and practice the skills together so they are prepared for the social situations they will encounter in life.

Going forward, these avenues present the opportunity to continue reaching remote students as well as rural school districts outside the Tulsa metro area.

Online Access for Schools

Operation Aware debuted an online portal for school partners this year to supplement Virtual and Virtual Plus programming. With individual sections for each week's lessons, teachers can access all links and materials for video presentations and further integrate Operation Aware concepts and conversations into their classrooms.

The portal is currently available for 4th through 6th grades with plans to expand to all grades as soon as possible. This accessibility will allow virtual school partners in urban and rural areas to stay connected throughout the program.
